

Covid-19 Charter

This document outlines how the organisation, our volunteers and our families will work together to minimise Covid risks on the holiday

SuperTroop will:

- Communicate regularly and clearly with helpers and families
- Monitor Scottish Government advice, and guidance from their agencies including Public Health Scotland, the Care Inspectorate and NHS Scotland
- Risk assess all activities in line with this guidance
- Plan a proportionate response to any changes in circumstances based on
 - Prioritising holiday-maker and helper safety and wellbeing
 - Transparency in planning and decision-making
 - Facilitating individual choice
- Provide Covid-19 test kits, personal protective equipment, and cleaning materials as needed

Volunteers will:

- Monitor communications and take advantage of all training opportunities
- Evaluate SuperTroop communications, ask questions as needed, and ultimately take responsibility for decisions around their own health and personal risks
- Seek a vaccination if willing to do so, and keep SuperTroop informed about their dosage schedule
- Perform Covid-19 testing as requested by SuperTroop, communicating their results promptly and clearly
- Minimise unnecessary contacts in the five days before the holiday
- Monitor for signs and symptoms of Covid-19 before, during and after the holiday and communicate promptly and clearly any observations

Holiday-makers and their families will:

- Evaluate SuperTroop communications, ask questions as needed, and ultimately take responsibility for decisions around their own health and personal risks
- Minimise unnecessary contacts in the five days before the holiday
- Monitor for signs and symptoms of Covid-19 before, during and after the holiday and communicate promptly and clearly any observations
